**Agency Mission /Objective:** The Ann Martin Center was established in 1963 with a bequest left by Ann Martin, M.D., a visionary pediatrician who helped found the Child Development Center at Oakland Children's Hospital. Dr. Martin's legacy was to establish community-based programs that attended to more than just the physical health and well-being of children. After her death, four

**Theoretical Orientation:** Interpersonal, Psychodynamic/Psychoanalytic, and Developmental

**Population:** The Center assists over 900 youth and adults annually through 24,000 hours of treatment services. Families are primarily from Alameda County with 60 percent living in Oakland. About 55 percent of our clients are African-American, Latino, or Asian. Diagnostically we see individuals with a wide range of presenting problems including mood and anxiety disorders, behavioral issues at home and at school, and relationship issues

**Training and Education:** Fellows will gain proficiency in working with children, adolescents, and their families in long-term psychotherapy. They will become familiar with psychoanalytic theory, child development, and psychodynamic diagnosis, and be able to formulate clinical case formulations, treatment plans, goals and objectives in order to conduct individual and family (parent) therapy. Additionally, post-doctoral fellows will learn how to administer, score, interpret, and write reports of psychological assessments conducted with children and adolescents.

**X- Cultural Training:** A core feature of the training program is emphasizing an understanding of ethical practice and awareness/recognition of issues of cultural and individual diversity that are relevant to provision of neuropsychological services. Increased understanding of cultural and individual diversity is provided through specific lectures addressing these topics in the mandatory rounds/seminar, as well as through individual supervision sessions and mandatory readings. Our program locations in 2 major metropolitan areas (San Diego and Orange County) provide fellows with the opportunity to work with a widely diverse population in terms of ethnic and cultural diversity.
