Agency Description: Fall Creek Counseling Associates is a private group practice serving Sacramento and Placer counties. Services include psychotherapy for all ages, including couples, families and groups, as well as psychological assessment. Our theoretical orientation is integrative.

Agency Mission /Objective: Provide psychotherapeutic services to an unrestricted population at affordable prices.

Theoretical Orientation: cognitive behavioral, interpersonal, psychodynamic/psychoanalytic, eclectic, and systems.

Population: Extremely diverse in terms of age, diagnosis, income, and ethnic background. We have an EPSDT contract with the county, and many of our cases are high risk kids and their families.

Training and Education: Girls Incorporated of Alameda County is a National affiliate, and the majority of our programs are to encourage, support, and develop girls (k-12) full potential skills and abilities.

Pathways Counseling provides therapy in many of the schools where Girls Inc. already has programming. In addition, Pathways provides a full range of services to boys, girls, men, women, children, and families in the clinic and in the community. The training program consists of: two -four hours didactic training seminar, two hours group supervision, two hours individual supervision, clinical documentation seminar, 18- 20 hours of direct service.

X- Cultural Training: Over half of the patients seen at Pathways Counseling center are non-Caucasian. Our training and supervision addresses this diversity both didactically and in the use of case examples. As well, our agency has a multicultural task force to assess and implement our agency goals around culture in the organization, programs, and community.

PostDoc Responsibilities: Interns provide 15-20 outpatient clinical hours at Pathways Counseling Center, Concordia Park, and/or in a school based setting. Most interns are placed in a school and the clinic to gain a variety of clinical experiences. IN the clinic they will be working mostly with children and families. Interns provide consultation to a variety of teachers and professionals at school sites. They screen students for acuity and, and screen and bill for Medical. Interns provide group therapy in the schools.

Interns with experience or interest will be trained to provide services for the Probation Department for Status Offending youth by providing crisis services to youth who have been temporarily placed in a crisis shelter for at-risk youth. The intern will conduct family meetings with at-risk youth and their parents/guardians to facilitate returning and/or unifying of youth with family. As well, interns are required and must maintain clinical files, provide EPSDT documentation and fill out various statistics. EPSDT documentation requires maintaining charts that are in compliance with county requirements which include the development and implementation of treatment plans, initial assessments and 6 month progress reports.

The agency provides and prequires interns to weekly attend: two to four hours (15 hours at the beginning of the internship) of training, two hours of group supervision, two hours of individual supervision, nd one hour of Clinical Documentation Seminar.

Prerequisites: Graduate from PsyD or PhD program.

Two years of clinical experience

Application Procedures: Send CAPIC uniform application, cover letter and CV, and two letters of recommendation to Training Coordinator, Vicci Tibbetts, or Program Manager, Ellen Lazone. At times, a preliminary phone interview will be arranged. There is a in-person interview that takes an hour-and-a-half.
