Agency Description:

Mount St. Mary's College is a private Catholic College of approximately 2,000 students, the majority of whom are women. The campus has two locations: Chalon in West Los Angeles and Doheny near downtown Los Angeles. Counseling and Psychological Services is comprised of two full-time licensed psychologist, one post doc and three half-time interns.

Agency Mission /Objective:

The department of Counseling and Psychological Services is dedicated to enhancing the emotional growth of students through promoting balanced lifestyles, developing positive self-esteem, and building life skills. In addition, CPS serves as a consultative and educational resource to the college community.

Training and Education: Postdocs will receive three hours of face-to-face individual supervision each week, one hour of case conference, one hour of didactic training and one hour of group supervision. Training will focus on short-term psychotherapy, crisis intervention, ethical issues, and college student issues.

X- Cultural Training: Through didactic presentations and ongoing supervision, postdocs receive training on issues of diversity in impoverished family backgrounds, ethnic/cultural identity, and classism.

PostDoc Responsibilities: 19-24 intakes and psychotherapy contacts, 3 hours of individual supervision, 1 hour of group supervision, 1 hour case conference, 1 hour training seminar, 4-7 hours clinical paperwork, 4-7 hours program planning and outreach, 1 hour on special projects.

Prerequisites: Doctorate degree in clinical or counseling psychology, prior experience performing intakes and providing psychotherapy to adults or young adults, and interest in outreach and consultation in the college setting.

Letter of intent, CV, official graduate school transcripts and 3 letters of recommendation (at least one from a current or recent clinical supervisor).
