Program Description:

The Children and Family Services Consortium (CYFSC) through the Professional Services Center (PSC) is located at Alliant International University in Los Angeles. The primary goal of the Consortium is to provide integrative school-based mental health services to multicultural students attending schools in the Alhambra Unified School District. The Consortium employs a team approach that includes teachers, school psychologists, counselors, nurses, resource specialists, school principals, other administrators, and family members. Service integration is further enhanced through collaboration with a network of community resources and assisting in the implementation of various grants.

Position Description:

Principal Responsibilities: Individual, group and family counseling, parent education, crisis intervention, case management, clinical supervision and research. The fellow may also assist in the development of grant/contract proposals, program evaluation, and preparation of publications.

Supervision/Training:

Weekly individual supervision is provided and meets the California Board of Psychology licensure requirements for supervised professional (postdoctoral) experience. The fellow also attends (both as a participant and occasional presenter) ongoing CYFSC seminars which address a wide variety of clinical, community, and school mental health issues. Additional training and supervision is provided by CYFSC administrative staff on supervisory skills, grant writing, and program development/evaluation.

Duration/Time Commitment/Schedule:

Starting: August 2009

Ending: July 2010

Full-Time: 40 hours/ week

Part-Time: 20 hours/ week

Schedule: Weekdays during school hours of operation with occasional evenings.

Stipend: This is a non-paid position.

Required qualifications

- Doctoral degree in clinical psychology (all requirements for the degree must have been met and the degree formally conferred by the awarding institution by 8/25/09)
- Clinical internship experience (a minimum of one year equivalent) serving culturally diverse children/youth in an outpatient program (must have included opportunities for individual, group and family interventions).
